#### An Invitation to Advent

As I write this, a New Year is nearly upon us. Advent, which begins November 29th this year, marks the launch of the Christian Year. It is a season of expectation and hope for those who gather around the story of Christ's coming. In our culture, it seems that Christmas has already arrived. But Advent isn't Christmas. It's a time of preparation and waiting more than celebration. In a way we're like Mary – we have a due date, but not yet a baby. There is work to be done, in us and in the world, to be ready for the coming of the Christ child.

So the new Christian Year is about to begin, and the calendar year is coming to an end. We are looking forward and backward at the same time. The past year was an important one for our church family, and for many of the families who make up our congregation. Some of us welcomed the gift of new life in the birth of a child or grandchild. Others lost family or friends whose lives touched and blessed our own for ever. This is true every year, we know. But we remember to give thanks for them and carry with us the gifts they shared.

We - you and I - met! We've been getting to know each other since August. We've been learning names, asking questions, telling stories, listening. In a way our work has been a bit like Advent itself – preparing the way for what comes next! We are counting on the same generous spirit and encouragement that has seen us through so far, to continue. Thank you. And well done.

Already, we have been through much together. From Sunday worship to the refugee sponsorship project, from weddings and funerals to baptisms and communion, feeding the hungry, studying the Bible, supporting and encouraging each other along the way. I believe that what we do as a church is important. It matters. It makes a difference in the lives of literally thousands of people, in our community and around the world.

The world needs generous, compassionate, hopeful people. The future depends on those who are able to see its brokenness, who feel its pain, and who yet remain faithful and loving in the face of it. Advent is an invitation for us to join with John the Baptist, preparing the way, and pointing toward the love God has shown to the world in Jesus Christ. It is a reminder that even when things seem most hopeless, something new is waiting...and we are not alone. It was into this same world that the Christ child was born. He is with us still.

### Scenes From This Fall at WVUC

#### Community luncheon - October 28, 2015

Guest speaker – Mary Grant talking about her life in London during the second world war.

In 1939 when war was declared, Mary was a child living in London, not far from Hyde Park and Buckingham Palace. The battle of Britain started in May, 1940 with bombs falling day and night. She remembers the sky over London was bright red and the noise from the bombs and anti aircraft guns was terrible. Her school was totally destroyed and those children in her class who were not evacuated to safe areas in the countryside, were taught in a house. People slept in subway stations and air raid shelters, everyone carried gas masks and all the windows had blackout curtains so no light showed for the bombers to have a target. At the



house where she lived they went to the wine cellar in the basement during the raids which was all concrete and considered safe unless there was a direct hit. Everybody listened to Mr. Churchill on the radio for his reports. Early 1944, the Germans launched V-I rockets and then that September the V-2's arrived, killing many people and destroying many areas of London. Food, clothing and staples were rationed and everyone had an ID bracelet, ID cards and ration books with them. Mary remembers when VE day came, the country celebrated, all the lights came on and she walked to Piccadilly Circus to watch the joyful crowd.


#### With Thanks:

#### **WVUC Syrian Refugee Project**

After research, discussion, and consultation with authorities, the Official Church Board has agreed to expand the outreach of WVUC to include the official sponsorship of Syrian refugees and to pursue the necessary required applications.

The Board also approved providing the necessary financial commitments of up to \$50,000 for two sponsorships; \$10,000 for the North Shore United Churches combined effort and \$40,000 for the direct sponsorship by WVUC. The Board endorses fundraising efforts to meet this financial commitment.

The North Shore Immigrant Inclusion Partnership's presentation on the Syrian Refugee Crisis. Rev. Newman will
offer the opening remarks, followed by North Shore Immigrant Inclusion Partnership Co-Chairs, Jenny Benedict,
(Director, West Vancouver Memorial Library) and Elizabeth Jones, (Executive Director, North Shore Multicultural
Society). Professor Dan Hiebert, Department of Geography, UBC will explain the crisis and present on the basics of
why so many have fled Syria, the pathways of escape, how they have become interwoven with other migrants, the
impacts on surrounding countries, the challenges arising in the EU, and the Canadian responses.

Our congregation's committee is chaired by John Mendes, and includes Jan Leonard, Victoria Mendes, and Lea Borlick. We ask for your support, your prayers, talents and resources to engage in our call to do God's work. 
